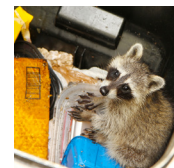

## Living with Wildlife Tips

You can help keep your neighborhood clean by doing the following:

- Avoid placing trash and recycling out on windy days.
- Put trash cans out the morning of collection day.
- Store trash and recycling in the garage if possible.
- Do not leave pet food or water outside.
- Trim ground-level shrubbery to reduce hiding places.
- Pick-up fallen fruit from the ground.
- Be sure to place your trash into a large trash bag and tie it closed before placing in the barrel. This will make clean-up efforts easier should the barrels tip over.

## Bulky Item Pick-Up

Single-family residential solid waste customers in the City of Rancho Cucamonga are eligible for up to four bulky item pick-ups per calendar year. Examples of bulky items include furniture, appliances, and televisions.

The service will not pick up vehicle parts, construction materials, or hazardous waste. Bulky item pick-ups must be scheduled at least 24 hours in advance of your regular service day. Do not place items at the curb until the morning of your scheduled collection day. For more information, or to schedule a pick-up, call Burrtec Waste Industries at (909) 987-3717.

Please note that services are interrupted on the following holidays:

**\*Due to the 2021 Christmas and 2022 New Year's Day holidays on Saturday, there will be no service interruptions or delays during the holiday weeks.**

*When the holiday falls on a weekday, collections for the remainder of the week will be delayed by one day. There is no service interruption or delay when the holiday falls on a Saturday or Sunday.*

## Residential EV Charging Incentive Pilot Program

The South Coast Air Quality Management District (South Coast AQMD) and the Mobile Source Air Pollution Reduction Review Committee (MSRC) has established a residential Electric Vehicle (EV) charging incentive program to offset Level 2 (240v) EV charger hardware costs. This program will be available to residents within the South Coast AQMD's four county jurisdiction. The program is administered on a first-come, first-served basis and provides up to a \$250 rebate or the cost paid for the charger, whichever is lower.

## Safe Sharps Disposal

The City of Rancho Cucamonga and the Rancho Cucamonga Fire Protection District have partnered to provide a safe method to dispose of home-generated sharps from Rancho Cucamonga residents. To participate:



1. Go to any Rancho Cucamonga fire station Monday through Friday, 8:00 am to 5:00 pm, to pick up a free sharps approved container.
2. Fill your container to the marked fill limit line, lock the lid to seal.
3. Exchange your container of used sharps for an empty one by returning it to any fire station, Monday through Friday, 8:00 am to 5:00 pm. Never leave sharps or full collection containers unattended if the crew is out of the station. Sharps disposal program is for Rancho Cucamonga residents only.

*Stations do not accept medications or hazardous waste.*
