



FACT SHEET

Cucamonga Station is a multi-modal transportation hub in the heart of the Inland Empire that is driving an economic transformation in San Bernardino County. It will elevate the region's foothold as a global connectivity point and destination to everything Southern California has to offer. Cucamonga Station will change how passengers will connect through smart, sustainable travel.

TRANSPORTATION CONNECTIVITY AT CUCAMONGA STATION AND APPLE VALLEY STATION

Cucamonga Station will be the first multi-modal transportation hub in the U.S. to connect true high-speed passenger rail service via Brightline West's Las Vegas to Southern California line, to Metrolink's regional passenger train service and Omnitrans bus services – all connecting to Ontario International Airport (ONT) through an existing shuttle service. The Brightline West Apple Valley Station will drive High Desert connectivity, and the Hesperia Station will focus on commuter service to Rancho Cucamonga.



BENEFITS AND ECONOMIC IMPACT

Brightline West expects to invest more than \$300 million in construction spending in Rancho Cucamonga; more than \$5 billion in San Bernardino County during construction.
